Pesticides/Insecticides
Automotive Products

Thermostats
Gasoline
Household cleaners
Pool/hobby chemicals
Oil-based paints
Waste oil

DO NOT Bring These Items

Fluorescent Bulbs*
Auto Batteries*
Computers*
Propane Tanks*
Alkaline Batteries
Gas Cylinders

Radioactive material
Hazardous product containers
Medical waste and medicines

** These items are accepted year-round at any LRSWMD drop off for a minimal fee.*

BUSINESSES MUST PRE-REGISTER!

If you are a Conditionally Exempt Generator of Hazardous Waste (less than 220 lbs./mo.), you should use these collections as a less expensive and more convenient method of hazardous waste disposal.

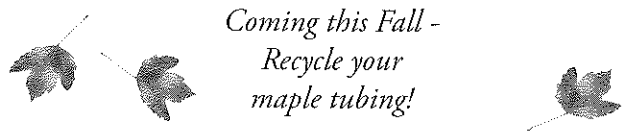

ATTENTION MAPLE PRODUCERS



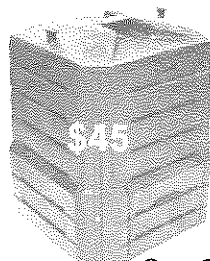
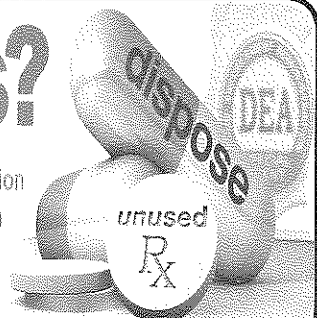
Coming this Fall -
 Recycle your
 maple tubing!

The District will be collecting polyethylene tubing used for maple syrup production at our Johnson Transfer Station on Wilson Road during the months of **SEPTEMBER** and **OCTOBER**. Mainline must be cut in 4 foot lengths. Metal wire must be removed but nylon fittings and spouts are acceptable. Some dirt and residue are OK. No material contaminated with oil will be accepted.

PVC tubing will NOT be accepted. Do the water test to see if you have PVC tubing. Drop a small section of your tubing in a bowl of water. If it FLOATS, it is acceptable, but if it SINKS, it's PVC. More information will be forthcoming in our Fall newsletter and in local newspapers. Can't wait until Fall? Call ahead for more information, 888-7317.

**NEW STATE LAW BANS
 ELECTRONIC WASTE FROM LANDFILLS**

As of January 1, 2011, you can no longer send your electronic waste (e-waste) to the dump. A new law mandates that e-waste be recycled. You can recycle these items for free after July 1st if you fit into one of the following categories:

- HOUSEHOLD
- CHARITY
- SCHOOL
- BUSINESS WITH LESS THAN 10 EMPLOYEES

E-waste that will be accepted for FREE are:

- COMPUTERS (HARD DRIVE, MONITOR, PERIPHERALS)
- PRINTERS
- TELEVISIONS
- CATHODE RAY TUBE CONTAINING PRODUCTS

E-waste that is BANNED and NOT ACCEPTED FOR FREE are:

- DVD AND CD PLAYERS, VCRS
- TELEPHONES, ANSWERING MACHINES, WIRELESS PHONES
- FAX MACHINES
- ELECTRONIC GAME CONSOLES
- E-DEVICE POWER CORDS AND CHARGES
- STEREO EQUIPMENT AND DIGITAL CONVERTER BOXES
- PDAs, MP3 PLAYERS AND OTHER PERSONAL E-DEVICES

Recycling locations have not yet been determined. Please check these websites for updated information on this e-waste law or call the LRSWMD at (802) 888-7317. This FREE program will be ongoing after July 1, 2011.

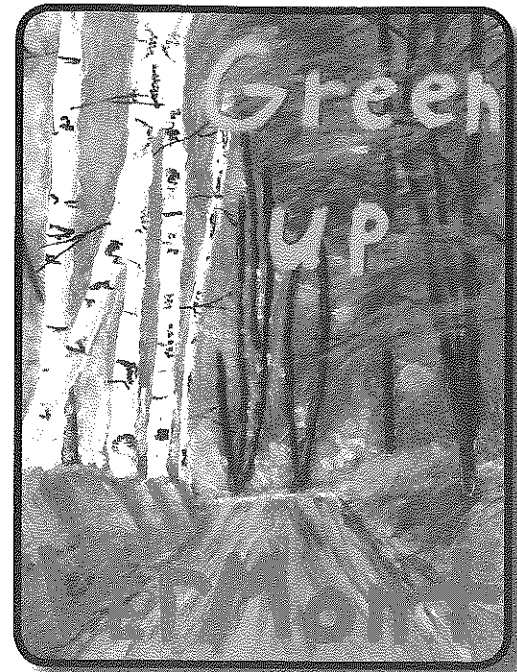


FEED A WORM...STARVE A LANDFILL™

Green Mountain Soil, located in Morrisville, is the leading supplier of red worms and worm castings in Vermont, and operates the only licensed and permitted vermicomposting facility in the state. Their mission is to reduce landfilling of organic waste (e.g. food scraps) by promoting residential vermicomposting (composting with worms). Worms are available for sale online at www.greenmountainsoil.com. Worm castings are available for sale at Evergreen Gardens in Waterbury, GTG Hydroponics in Jericho, and local pickup in Morrisville. Kurt also practices Integrated Pest Management. Voles and moles think worms taste really good. They can cause some real problems for vermicomposters. To combat this problem, Kurt adopted a cat from the Central VT Humane Society's Barn Cat Program, www.cvhumane.com. "Fluffy" has made quite a dent in the vermin population and saved many worms' lives!

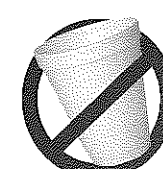
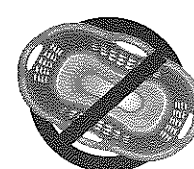

Help us keep contaminants out of the recycling stream!

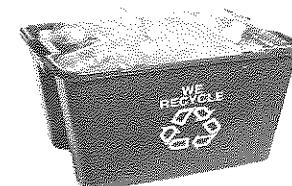

WHAT CAN I BRING? FOR LATEX PAINT ONLY! Cans must state "Clean up with water" or "Acrylic". CAN NOT be oil-based paint stating "*Flammable*" or "*Combustible*".

HOW MUCH CAN I BRING? **Limit 10 gallons per household.**

DO NOT BRING oil based paints, driveway sealer, joint compound or any other household hazardous wastes.

This collection is for **HOUSEHOLDS ONLY** - **No business waste will be accepted.** There is no cost to households for this collection. This service is provided as a courtesy to Lamoille Regional Solid Waste Management District households only.
